

Colorado Caucus Information

A caucus is a meeting where local members of a political party register their preference among candidates running for office. In each caucus state, Republicans and Democrats set their own rules. This election year, Colorado will host both primaries and caucuses.

The caucuses are open ONLY to registered party members and contain their own set of parameters.

In Colorado, voters CANNOT elect presidential candidates at the caucuses but they can elect representatives from their respective parties for the national conventions.

March 5: Colorado's presidential primary. With polling stations open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and ballot drop boxes will remain open until 7 p.m. Because Colorado is a mail ballot state, registered voters will begin to receive their ballots in the mail in February. Each party's choice for president will move on to the state's November ballot.

The Democratic caucus in Colorado The Colorado Democratic Party Precinct Caucuses will take place between **March 5-9, 2024**. [To find details on your county's caucus, visit coloradodems.org/counties-23.](#)

The Democratic Party's precinct caucuses are open to registered Democrats. Ahead of the caucus, members are invited to apply as delegates to represent Colorado at the Democratic National Convention in August. At the caucus, the party will vote on delegates for the convention.

The Republican caucus in Colorado: The Colorado Republican Party Precinct Caucuses will take place **March 7, 2024** and are open to registered Colorado Republican voters only. At the caucus, the party will vote on delegates for the Republican National Convention in July. During a presidential election year, Colorado has two different primary election dates.

June 25, 2024: Colorado's party primary election will decide who represents their party for a variety of congressional, statehouse and local elected positions. Polling stations will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. and ballot boxes open until 7 p.m., with ballots mailed earlier in June.

NOTE: Colorado's primary elections allow unaffiliated voters to participate as well. **Unaffiliated voters will receive primary ballots from both parties but can only submit one of the ballots for their vote to count.**
